



Flu Germs Busted by Chlorine!

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
Meet the Superheroes!




The Electron Grabber is a fun way to think about chlorine chemistry and how it is used to fight germs.


Flu season is a time when you might be coughing, sneezing and missing out on fun because you don't feel well.



Flu season is a busy time for the superheroes who use the power of chlorine to bust the germs that cause flu.




Flu is spread by germs known as viruses. All germs are too small to see without a microscope. Seasonal flu, H1N1 flu (or "Swine Flu") and the common cold are spread by viruses.



Through a high-powered microscope, most viruses look a lot like hairy blobs.

Cold and flu viruses have a sneaky way of spreading from one person to another. When someone who has a virus coughs or sneezes, millions of virus germs shoot into the air inside tiny drops of mucous and land on surfaces.



You can catch the flu if you touch your mouth, nose or eyes after touching a surface, like a desk, where virus "drops" have landed.



To slow down the spread of flu, adults can use a germ buster like chlorine to kill germs on desks, doorknobs, handrails and other hard surfaces.



To avoid the flu, wash your hands often. Use warm water and soap and remember to scrub between your fingers. Wash for as long as it takes you to sing the "Happy Birthday Song" twice.




